IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED AT POLLS (F.S. 101.043)

The clerk or inspector shall require you, upon entering the polling place, to present one of the following current and valid picture identifications:

- United States Passport
- Debit or Credit Card
- Military identification
- Public Assistance I.D.

- Student identification
- Retirement Center identification
- Neighborhood Association identification
- Veteran health ID card issued by U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs
- A license to carry a concealed weapon or firearm issued pursuant to
- Employee ID card issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the Federal Government, the state, a county, or municipality.

If the picture identification does not have your signature, an additional identification that provides your signature shall be required. If you are unable to furnish the required identification, you shall be allowed to vote a provisional ballot. The canvassing board shall determine the validity of the ballot.
